

How to Request Accompaniment for Immigration-Related Appointments in Western WA

- → Hotline volunteers speak English & Spanish.
- → Submit your request with as much lead time as possible, and at least 4 business days prior to your appointment.

The role of an accompaniment volunteer:

- Offer a friendly, supportive presence so that the person or family does not have to go to the appointment alone in what are often confusing or hostile environments.
- Support the requester as they navigate a complex government process, and when asked, leverage their English skills, citizenship privilege or familiarity with how a process works.
- Volunteers cannot provide legal support. If you are seeking legal counsel, we can offer you referrals.
- Volunteers have gone through CCGS training and signed confidentiality agreements.

Types of accompaniment you can request:

- > USCIS appointments in Tukwila- biometrics (fingerprints) and interviews.
- > Ankle bracelet monitoring check-in at BI Inc. in Tukwila.
- Administrative appointments in King County. Ex: Social Security cards, driver's licenses & WA state IDs, passports, name changes, food stamps.
- Other types of appointments will be considered on a case-by-case basis, depending on volunteer & organizational capacity.
- > State Court (non-immigration court) accompaniment where there is a fear of ICE presence.
- > NW Detention Center Bond Hearings in Tacoma.

CCGS is partnering with the Washington Immigrant Solidarity Network (WAISN) to offer accompaniment throughout the region.
